

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Top Five Destinations In Denmark

- Copenhagen is Denmark's vibrant capital city and the country's cultural and financial center.
 Fantastic Nyhavn and intriguing Christianshavn are major draws for visitors. Drop down into one of many classic bars in Nyhavn for a beer. The city is full of Dutch Renaissance architecture and medieval churches. It has fantastic restaurants, buzzing nightlife, and great shopping.
- Odense Is the charming birthplace of Han Christian Anderson. This was also the haven for worshippers of the Norse Gods. The city is full of vibrant colors and a strong sense of community. Many sites to visit include Funen's Abbey, the 11th Century Saint Canute's Cathedral, and the Viking Castle.
- 3. Aarhus and its environs have Iconic sites, a lively music scene, pristine beaches, castles, and twisted forests. This eighth-century fortified Viking settlement was a trade center for centuries due to its strategic location. It is famous for its music festivals. The old town area has beautifully preserved houses and is lovely to stroll through. The 13th-century Aarhus Cathedral is well worth a visit.
- 4. **The wild and untouched Northern shores,** Beautiful windswept seaside, buried churches, and dramatic nature.
- Kronborg Castle is the magnificent 13th-century home of Shakespeare's Hamlet in the town of Elsinore. It is dramatic in both architecture and setting.

- Danish pastry originated in Austria. It was brought there by relocated Austrian bakers who replaced Danish bakers when they went on strike.
- Bike culture is prevalent and considered a safe and effective mode of transport. Denmark has 12,000 km of bike paths and lanes. 75% of Danes continue to bike in the winter, and 50% bike to work daily.
- Danes are the world's highest consumers of coffee.
- Soccer is the national sport.
- The two oldest amusement parks in the world reside in Denmark. Walt Disney visited Tivoli Gardens in Copenhagen and was so inspired he created Disneyland.

Good to know before you go

- Tipping is not needed in Denmark, as it is included in your bill. It is not customary or expected. This includes restaurants, cab drivers, porters, bartenders, and other service workers. Credit cards are accepted everywhere.
- Overall, the clothing is stylish and well-kept. They are casual dressers, often wearing jeans and comfortable shoes. Women do wear dresses often, and nylon stockings remain trendy.
- Do not jaywalk in Denmark, or you will be fined. Danes are rule followers, which is why their society is so organized.
- Driving is easy in Demark with normal rules of the road. Just be very careful with bicycles!
- Before getting on a bike in Denmark, become familiar with the norms. There is a bike traffic issue, which can overwhelm visitors. Practice first!!
- The life of a Dane is often defined by three words: simplicity, politeness, and equality.
- Danish people don't give much value to possessions or high income. The simple life is the essence of the Danes.
- Greetings in Denmark are polite with a handshake. The Danes consider initiating a conversation with them while riding public transportation to be disrespectful.
- Women and Men are equal in Denmark. They receive equal compensation.
- Danes are happy and peaceful people.
- The Danes are very private people, and the unspoken rule of privacy is always to be respected. If you walk by a home with open windows, do not peer inside; it is viewed as very rude.
- They pay the highest taxes in the world for their healthcare, social services, and unemployment.
- Denmark has a deep folk music history. The arts are essential to their lives, and many concerts and music programs are available for travelers.
- The Danes are known for their Folklore and storytelling. You will be richly rewarded if you can engage them to share a story.
- Denmark has a heavy seafood and meat diet.
- The Danes prefer to be left alone and would appreciate it if you left their dogs alone, too. Admire from a distance.
- The weather can be harsh, and even summers never get that hot. Plan layers even for summer travel.
- Most Danes speak excellent English.
- Spirits are expensive in Denmark. Beer is the most popular drink.
- Most restaurants and tourist sites do not allow smoking.
- It is a very safe country.

When to travel to Denmark

Denmark is a top-rated destination for tourists. It is the happiest place to live on earth, so why wouldn't you want to be there? It also rains (rarely snow) every other day of the year, so weather can be an issue if you don't plan for it. During the peak tourist season, July & and August can be crowded. May and September can still have nice weather but with fewer crowds.

Summers stay mild but may get chilly or feel like there is no summer. June is the driest month of the year. Days are long, and you will see everyone outside. Winter months are the low season, but the

Christmas markets and festivals draw many visitors; keep that in mind. The noted "Hygge" indeed does occur in winter, and Danes just cozy up in their home for the short, cold days.

Overall, Denmark can be a year-round destination if you plan accordingly.



























































They are the premier global air medical transport. One caveat to travel insurance is that medical evacuation usually gets you to the closest facility to care for you. Medjet gets you back to the U.S. to the hospital of your choice once you are stable enough to fly. They cover COVID-related transport as well.

Medjet carries its own policies. These policies are only for transport and do not cover other aspects of travel insurance. They have individual trip policies starting at \$99 and annual policies for around \$300. Most of their policies limit the age to 74 and younger. Prices are not based on age below that.

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
