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


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




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
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


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
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




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




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
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





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







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










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Funs facts about Crete

1. Crete is Greece's largest and most populated island, with over 634,000 people. It has over 160 miles of beaches.

2. It is believed Crete was the center of the oldest civilization on earth, the Minoans. The Minoan civilization took place between 2700 to 1420 BC.

3. The landscape of Crete is very mountainous, with the Idi range having a height of 8,058 and the Lefka Ori at an elevation of 8,045 feet.

4. Crete is 160 miles from Athens and 200 miles north of Africa. Close enough to the oil-rich Rumanian oil fields, it made it of strategic interest to Nazi Germany. The US Navy maintains a base on the island.

5. Crete has two, Elafonissi and Balos, of the ten pink beaches in the world.

6. The Cretan air is reputed to have healing powers and even can perform miracles. This is stated so by the "father of medicine," Hippocrates.

7. Crete is the birthplace of Zeus. In Greek mythology, the God of Sky and Thunder is said to have been born high in the Cretan mountain.

8. There are olive tree groves throughout the whole island. The Greeks love their olive oil for every purpose you can imagine. An average person in Crete consumes 30 liters a year.

9. The Palace of Knossos has evidence that people lived here up to 9000 years ago. It is believed by some to be the oldest city in Europe.


10. Wild goats can be found everywhere on the island of Crete. There are plenty of species, but the most common is the native mountain Kri-Kri goats.

11. As you drive around Crete, the massive gorges are a frequent sight. There are over 400 beautiful gorges.

12. Crete has expansive grade vineyards and, as a result, has some wonderful wines. It is Greece's second-largest wine-producing zone.

13. Greek myth explains why there are no harmful animals in Crete. Hercules drove all harmful animals away from Crete to please the god Zeus.

14. Many famous people originated from Crete, but a modern-day celebrity has strong Crete roots. Jennifer Aniston's father was born in Crete before emigrating to the US.



They are the premier global air medical transport. One caveat to travel insurance is that medical evacuation usually gets you to the closest facility to care for you. Medjet gets you back to the U.S. to the hospital of your choice once you are stable enough to fly. They cover COVID-related transport as well.

<u>Medjet</u> carries its own policies. These policies are only for transport and do not cover other aspects of travel insurance. They have individual trip policies starting at \$99 and annual policies for around \$300. Most of their policies limit the age to 74 and younger. Prices are not based on age below that.
